While no figures are as yet available, indications are that the amount raised will be far in advance of that pledged last

A., so the actual canvassing and collecting of the pledges is done by some member of each of the houses respectively. Some of these houses have not handed in their reports, due, in part, to the inability of the canvasser to make a complete report on account of the temporary absence of some of its members.

Results Satisfactory "The campaign is measuring up quite favorably to our expectations, though more time is being consumed than we had anticipated," said Karpenstein yesterday afternoon. "We are not hurrying the drive to completion too soon, we are trying to reach every man and give him an opportunity to contribute toward the financial support of the "Y" and to become personally interested in its welfare."
