The Phi Beta Kappa fraternity was founded in December, 1776, at the Williams and Mary college, Williamsburg, Virginia. At this time it was a secret organization, having for its badge a square silver medal with the Greek letters Phi Beta Kappa upon the face. Later, this was replaced by the familiar key, bearing the same Greek let-

In 1831, under pressure of the agitation prevalent against secret organizations, the Harvard chapter gave up its mysteries and after that the fraternity became an organization to which only those who attained an unusual scholarship rec-

ord were elected. The Alpha chapter of the University of Oregon was installed in 1922. Several chapters have been granted other universities since that time, bringing the total to 99 Charters for chapters of Phi Beta Kappa can be granted only to those Universities and colleges in which students receive B. A. degrees.


