

### VOLLEYBALL GAME WON BY FROSH FIRST TEAM

#### Victory Upsets Prediction of Sport Officials

The results of last night's volleyball meets disrupted the most carefully considered predictions of coach, volleyball head and class managers as to the winner of the championship. Yesterday, anyone would have been willing to stake a lot on the sophomores carrying off the honors. But their defeat last night by the freshman first team by a 33 to 21 score has wrecked all the nice calculations to the final results of the round robin tournament.

The freshmen are out of the race. They have lost three games, and even if they should win their last two, these victories would not compensate their former losses. The seniors have met and defeated both the freshman first and second teams, and should they do as well in the meets with the sophomores and juniors they would come out the champion.

The results of the other games played tonight are as follows: junior second 50, senior second 8; sophomore third 38, freshman third 36; senior first 34, freshman second 17; junior first 38, sophomore second 20; freshman fourth won from junior third by default.

The dual cross country meet with the University of Washington before the Thanksgiving football game in the Stadium at Seattle, will be called off unless the condition of the Oregon team improves so that they can be sent North.

Hard luck hit the team this week, with Neidermeier and Kelly, two members of the team which raced against a strong Idaho team two weeks ago, and succeeded in winning third place in the Northwest conference meet, unable to train on account of minor colds. If they can get into shape, Bill Hayward will take the team to Seattle.

Holder, Jamison, and Runk are still pounding the cinders and taking long treks through Hendricks park over the three mile course.

The meet with Washington is the final event of the year. The scheduled race with O. A. C. last week end was not run because the Aggie team withdrew. The conference meet of the week before at the University of Idaho marked the beginning of the season. It is upon the cross country men this fall that Bill Hayward is depending for his distance men for the varsity track team next spring. Against a strong quintet of distance men at Seattle the team's showing will indicate the strength that Oregon will have in the two mile and mile in the track conference meets in 1926.
