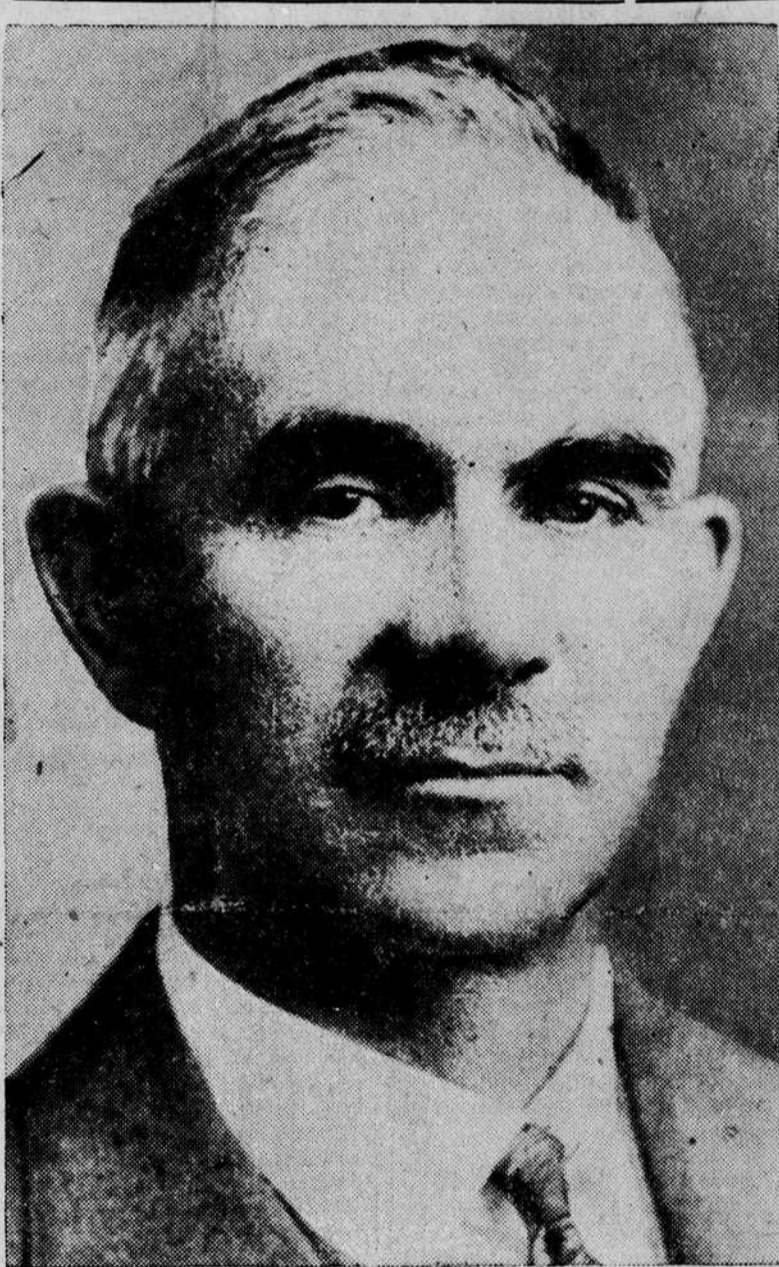
Table with columns for Year, Oregon, and Idaho. Shows Oregon's record from 1901 to 1925.

University and Oregon Agricultural College Boards of Regents Confer

At a meeting of the University of Oregon regents Friday morning, Burt Brown Barker was named vice-president of the University this filling a newly created office; and Alfred Powers, head of the summer school for 1927, was again appointed head of the session for 1928.

A total of \$41,000 was set aside for the session of the summer school, it was announced. The faculty and other officers will be named at a later meeting.

Following the session of the University regents, a joint meeting with the regents of Oregon Agricultural College was held, at which a discussion of how cooperation can best be secured for the mutual benefit of both institutions was the feature.

"The University and O. A. C., as representative of the highest type of education in the state, must have many problems in common. It is the purpose of these joint meetings to bring these problems before us, that they may be solved to the satisfaction of all," Governor I. L. Patterson declared.

Burt Brown Barker Elected by Regents To Vice-Presidency

New York Lawyer to Take Charge of Public Relations and Gift Campaign for Oregon; Former Oregonian Friend of President Hall

Because it is felt by the board of regents that the rapid growth of the University of Oregon has brought about more executive duties than one man can reasonably perform, and because the opportunity has presented itself to the University to add a man of specially high calibre to its staff, Burt Brown Barker, prominent lawyer and educator of Chicago and New York has been named vice-president in charge of public relations of the University, it was announced here following the regular meeting of the regents yesterday.

This step, regarded as the most important to the University since the election of Dr. Arnold Bennett Hall as president, has been taken after a consideration of the present needs of the University, and after the aims and desires of Mr. Barker were made clear and understood by officials of the University and prominent alumni throughout the state.

Barker Writes Open Letter To Dr. Hall, Students

Montclair, New Jersey, Oct. 7.—(Special) — Burt Brown Barker, noted lawyer and educator of New York and Chicago, today accepted the position of vice president in charge of public relations at the University of Oregon at Eugene, Oregon, he announced. Mr. Barker, who is now associated with several important legal cases, will move to Oregon to make his home as soon as he can dispose of his business interests, he states.

In Oregon Mr. Barker will take over much of the executive work now being done by Dr. Arnold Bennett Hall, president of the University of Oregon. He will also be placed in charge of the gift campaign which the University is conducting.

Sousa Writes March For Oregon; No Other Coast State Honored

The University of Oregon will have a snappy march, written by John Philip Sousa himself, and dedicated to the University.

This was the news received today direct from his manager, Harry Askin, by telegraph. The University will be the only institution on the Pacific coast to have a march by Sousa. Minnesota is the only university so honored in the Middle West, and but one or two others have received such attention.

Judge Ben Lindsey To Speak in Eugene

The fall lecture series will open in Eugene, October 20, with a talk by Judge Ben Lindsey of Denver on "Companionate Marriage."

Control Board to Make University Purchases

The University of Oregon has been officially notified that the state board of control will do all of the purchasing for the University. This is the result of a law passed at the last state legislature, requiring the board to make all purchases for state institutions.
