

Music Goes With Food At Campus Luncheon Today

Dances This Evening Will Draw Large Crowd Of Visitors

Students will eat at the big campus luncheon in McArthur court starting at 11:30 a. m. and ending at 1 p. m. today to the tune of Burton's Co-Ed orchestra. The latter has offered its services free of charge for the occasion.

The menu of the lunch is composed of the following: Creamed chicken on biscuits, brown bread sandwiches, green olives, sweet pickles, ice cream sandwiches, coffee, apples. To supply the huge crowd, Mrs. Henry W. Davis, director of the halls of residence, and Nellie Johns, student chairman of the luncheon, have ordered 1500 pounds of chicken, 200 loaves of bread, 40 pounds of butter, 25 gallons each of olives and pickles, 400 bricks of ice cream, and 25 pounds of coffee.

Students are urged to assist in keeping the floor of McArthur court clean. A great deal depends on their co-operation as to how soon the floor will be ready for the underclass dance in the evening.

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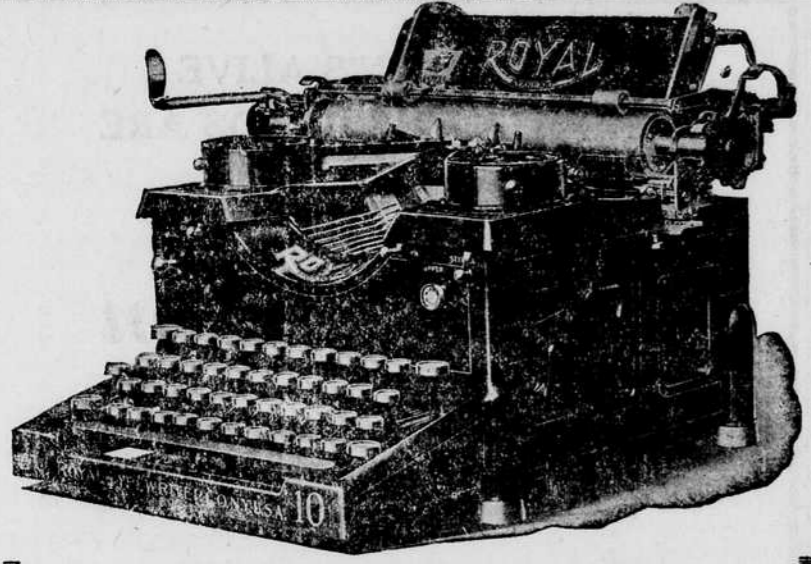
