Upperclass Swimmers To Present Exhibition Today at Four

A feature of the entertainment of the High School Conference will be a demonstration of swimming for the high school girls from 4 to 4:20 Friday afternoon in the Woman's building. The exhibition will be given by the more advanced swimmers, under Miss Ernestine Troemel's supervision. After the demonstration, the pool will be open for use to the delegates if they care to take advantage of the privilege.

Swimming is becoming quite popular with University girls since practise for class teams has begun. Quite a number are coming out and May Moore, head of swimming, and Miss Troemel, the instructor, urge all others who are interested to come out for some class team. Expertness is not essential; all that is

necessary is interest in the sport and a good foundation knowledge of one stroke.

The teams are graded into first, second, third and fourth teams in each class so that every girl who comes out will make one team and gain points in W. A. A.

Practise hours are Monday and Thursday from 5 to 5:30 for seniors and freshmen, and Tuesday and Friday from 5 to 5:30 for juniors

and sophomores. Wednesday the same hour is open to all classes. While three hours' practise a week is required in other sports, a half an hour twice a week is the maximum requirement in swimming.

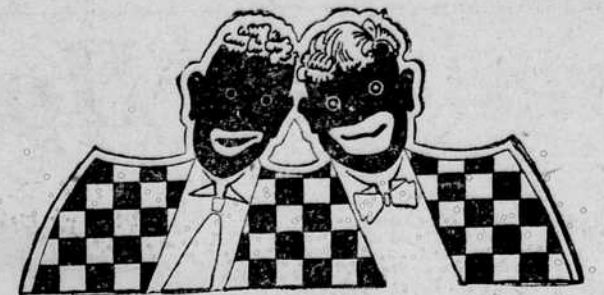
