

### Given to Hoover For Presidency

#### Membership in League Is Approved; Dry Law Changes Asked

Faculty returns from the recent current questions poll held on the campus Thursday, show that there is no great deviation from the opinions of the students and those of the administration. Herbert Hoover and Al Smith were the dominant candidates of the two parties although Hoover led the field by a large majority.

As to the success of the prohibition amendment, the results also compared favorably with those of the students. The vote stood 61 for and 74 against. And believe it or not, the faculty also stood out in favor of modification of the dry laws. A substantial change was wanted by 72, while 56 voted for more rigid enforcement and 13 for complete repeal.

Faculty for League

A stronger proportion of faculty members than of students desired fermal membership in the League of Nations. There were 95 votes cast for membership, 37 for informal cooperation and 10 for complete detachment.
