



## Fifteen Men Lost When Oil Explodes **On Chile Steamship**

(By United Press) SAN PEDRO, Cal., Feb. 17.--Fifteen members of the crew were lost when the steamship Chucky, owned by the Chile Steamship Company of New York, sank after it was ripped asunder by a terrific explosion of 65,000 barrels of oil off the coast of Japan Wednesday, according to reports reaching here tonight.

Twenty-one members of the crew who leaped into the sea and clung to wreckage were picked up by a Japanese fishing vessel and taken to Hachijoshima Island, it was said. Those who were killed were either blown to pieces or burned by the fire which followed the explosion.

### A Federal Troops Slay **55** Mexican Bandits

(By United Press) MEXICO CITY, Mexico, Feb. 17. -Fifty-five rebels have been killed in the last few days, mostly in the Jalisco region, according to dispatches received today. Military authorities at Amatlan telegraphed that a group of rebels preparing to attack the town of Cimatlin were defeated by federals and twentyfive rebels were killed. Seven others who were captured, were immediately executed. Reports of Federal successes at several points is believed here to indicate the government is winning its campaign to exterminate the rebels.


