## Crowley Places High in Golf Tilt

Stanford Man Takes First  
Place in Contest

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., April 19. (Special)—A terrible wind caused high scores for fourteen golfers representing seven schools at the Pacific coast intercollegiate 54-hole medal tournament on the Ocean side course of the Olympic club here today.

Ed Crowley, Webfoot divot digger, finished today's play of 18 holes in fourth place. He was three strokes ahead of Meyberg, Stanford captain, and one stroke behind Chack Hunter, Washington's star performer, both favorites to win high honors. Ditzler, California, led the field with a 78. Connors, U. S. C., was next with 80; Hunter, Washington, 82; Crowley, Oregon, 83; Turner, U. S. C., 84; Meyberg, Stanford, 86; and Devlin, Stanford, 87.

Crowley was playing a fine game when the wind blew his ball into a sand trap and it took him two sevens on easy par four holes to get in the running again. It was this stroke of hard luck that cost Crowley medal honors.

In the combined team scores, California leads. Oregon, Stanford, and Washington are all bunched for second place; with two strokes apart. The remaining 36 holes of the tournament will be played on the Lake-side course of the Olympic club tomorrow. Giffen's score today was not in the scoring.

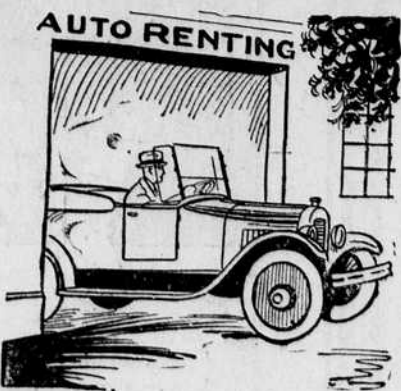
