ficient is the requisite intention be present. That intention must be a bona fide intention to make a home. No form of words and no series of acts will establish a residence, although words and acts are evidence from which an inference may be drawn as to what one's intention is. There must be more than a bare expression of intention, one must actually have the intention of making the place his home before he can be said to be domiciled there. Abiding in a place with the intention of staying there temporarily, no matter for what purpose, to attend school or otherwise, does not establish residence unless there is formed an honest intention to make that his real

The constitution of Oregon has the following provision: "For the purpose of voting, no person shall be deemed to have gained or lost a residence by reason of his presence or absence while employed in the


