In consideration of scholarship records it will be a simple matter to check over a student's card to decide whether she has been neglecting her studying for her extracurricular interests,

National inspectors of sororities want complete records of members, which they will be able to secure through examination of the activity cards.

#### Cards to Be Complete

Girls now in school are filling out their records up to date for all the time they have been on the campus. As soon as this work is completed and the eards have been filed, they will be kept up to date by the office of the dean of women, through announcements of elections to offices or honoraries made in the Emerald. At the end of each term the girls will be asked to cheek over their cards and see if any cor rections should be made.

This system for recording activities is believed to be the first one of its kind in the country. Some schools have complete systems, but none have the same arrangement as the University of Oregon, according to Miss Hazel Prutsman, acting dean of women, who has worked out the scheme.
