Varsity track is getting pretty well under way. New warm-ups of bright green are being distributed to the squad, the old outfits being used by the intramural and frosh squads.

The weather has been bad for outdoor work. The cinder track would be ruined if men were allowed to run on it. Moreover, indoor work is not possible at present. The special indoor shoes that were supposed to arrive no later than yesterday have not yet shown up.

**Takes on New Life**

There is a healthier attitude toward work and competition about the track now than there has been for some years. The reason is that there is a lot of good material on hand. Ed Moeller, as one example, is a potential world champion discus thrower, and is good for a lot of points during the season in other events.

Six lettermen are in school this term. They are Bill Crawford, 120 high hurdles, sprints and high jump; Harold Kelley, hurdles and sprints; Homer Dickson, shot and javelin; George Stager, discus; Bill Prendergast, sprints; and Lyle McGee, hurdles.

**Sophs Good Prospects**

Then there are on hand a lot of good sophomores and experienced men who have not earned letters. Some of these are Bobby Robinson, pole-vault; Ernest McKittrick, distance; Ralph Hill, distance; Edward Siegmund, hurdles; Ed Jensen, distance; Marion Hall, weights; and a number of other likely prospects.

Last spring the frosh were exceptionally strong on the cinders, while the varsity was pitiable in that department, having had to depend on the field-event men to make any sort of respectable team showing at all. In fact, the varsity field men scored only 58 points to the opponents' 173, and left the weight-men and jumpers to make 83 and 56 points to the opponents' 78 and 1-6.

## Dayton Beats Oregon In Close Rifle Match

Man With Score of 366**

With a total score of 3,594 points the University of Dayton, Ohio, repeated the University of Washington's performance by defeating the University of Oregon's rifle team in matches held last week, according to a letter bearing the score from the eastern college. The Oregon team's score was 3,521, being 73 points below that of Dayton. Washington beat Oregon 99 points in the same match.

High point man for Dayton built up a total of 372 points, while Oregon's high man, Harvey Wright, had a score of 366. The shooting was done from four positions; namely, prone, sitting, kneeling, and standing.

This week the rifle team shoots against Kemper Military school, Booneville, Missouri; University of Illinois, Champaign, Illinois; and Washington State college, Pullman.
