

Oregon Rifle Team Meets Third Defeat

H. Wright Wins Highest Score in Contest for Intercollegiate Men

Next Week Ends Matches For University Team

The University of Oregon rifle team was defeated last week by all of its three opponents. Oregon's score was 3,522; the North Dakota Agricultural college had 3,583; the Agricultural and Mechanical college of Texas, 3,634; the University of Cincinnati, 3,695.

The North Dakota college, last year's national intercollegiate rifle champion, scored 61 points or about six points per man more than did Oregon. The Texas school won by 112 points, and the University of Cincinnati took their match by 83 points.

For the fourth consecutive time Harvey Wright led Oregon's marksmen, this time with 373 points, the highest individual score in last week's match.

Results of the ninth corps area competition have not been received as yet, according to Capt. C. H. Bragg, coach. Last year 17 colleges competed, and this year 19 are entered. Oregon is expected to place among the first ten, as it improved last year's score by 200 points. The corps area includes all colleges having senior unit R. O. T. C. departments within the states of Oregon, Washington, California, Utah, Nevada, Idaho, Montana, and Wyoming.

The matches this week are with the Culver Military academy, Rhode Island State college, and Lafayette college of Pennsylvania. Next week will end the season for the Oregon marksmen.

Lee Brown Addresses Business Men of State

Purpose of Talks to Give Data for Thesis Papers

Lee M. Brown, graduate student in the school of sociology, is delivering addresses to chambers of commerce in Oregon and is submitting questionnaires to leading business and professional men and women in the state, particularly those who are members of chambers of commerce and service clubs, to supply data for his master's thesis. The purpose of the survey is to investigate opinion with reference to basic social and economic developments, and the effect of these on social thought, social institutions, social control, and higher education.

In addition to between 3,000 and 4,000 questionnaires which have been mailed over the state, Brown spoke to the McMinnville chamber of commerce at its weekly luncheon on February 18 on "The Study of Social Science and the Student's Relation to Social Developments and Social Problems." After the talk the questionnaires were distributed. Brown also spoke at Linfield to one of Professor Harold Elkington's classes. He explained the nature and purpose of the research project.

Seven-day Shelf Gets Biographies, Essays
