OREGON'S claim to football supremacy is safe for another week, now that the Webfoots ran rough-shod over the Idaho Vandals in their game Saturday. Oregon played brilliantly and would have given any team in the conference a good fight. Johnny Kitzmiller clearly outplayed his up and coming rival, and the Dutchman can chalk up a victory over the Swedes, even though Pederson's mother was French. Kitz was at his best against the Vandals, and he gave one of the best passing exhibitions ever seen on Multnomah field. His punting was above reproach and he also contributed his share of tackles.

MUCH of the "flying Dutchman's" success should be credited to the Oregon wingmen, Woodie Archer and Jack Erdley, who did everything good ends are supposed to do. Archer's ability to, snare passes was almost uncanny, while Erdley did some beautiful blocking. 
