THIRTY-one Oregon football players will board the Shasta this noon for San Francisco, on the first lap of the long journey to Miami, Florida. Of the men leaving today, five will return after the St. Mary's game in Kezar stadium, as only twenty-six players will be taken to Florida. Coach McEwan, Prink Callison, Bill Hayward, trainer, Jack Benefiel, three faculty members, and Mike Gray, student manager, will complete the party. The squad will arrive in the Bay City Wednesday morning and will hold a short workout that afternoon. The Thanksgiving day game will start at 11 o'clock in the morning, to enable the fans to get home in time for their turkey dinners.

THE Webfoot traveling party will leave San Francisco at 6 o'clock Thursday night on the Sunset Limited to travel to the southern tip of Florida to meet the University of Florida 'Gators, in Oregon's most important game of the season. Almost all of the reserved seats for the game have already been sold, and indications are that the standing room only sign will be hung out long before game time. Several special trains will be run from Gainesville, the home of the 'Gators, to Miami for the game, and a special train from New York has been scheduled. The game will be a part of the official dedication ceremonies of the new Madison Square Gardens arena at Miami, and it will be a gala day for the southern city.
