And if it does continue, there would yet remain the proposed judiciary which could hardly maintain that the enforcement power would be delegated to any organization by common consent. Continued protest in the Emerald Forum column and elsewhere would be sufficient proof that common consent is lacking.

It would appear then, that students will be able to vote on the question at the constitutional referendum. If the constitutional committee does not decide the matter, and if the proposed judicial measures are approved, there freshmen may bring their griev-
