Dr. Hall's Speech "That meant a man who was outstanding as a masterful character, many of the battlers. one who was possessed of a great student of the game and a great

teacher and trainer of men. I wanted an inspiring leader, who believed in the fundamental importance of training manhood and building character. Utopian Coach Described "I wanted a man who could train our students in fighting courage, in unfailing loyalty, in clean, aggressive manhood and in noble sportsmanship. I wanted a master of men, capable of training and inspiring his men for clean. aggressive and heroic exploits upon the gridiron and who had the

Even small schools like Oregon can have splendid futures and abundant opportunities for creative leadership.

"Other positions, with larger remunerations and less labor, opened up to our distinguished guest, but he chose Oregon, the offer that carried with it the lowest salary of any that he received. But we hope it carried the largest opportunity of them all."
