Ably assisted by his teammates, "Cap" brought the score to 24 to 25 when only 50 seconds were left. Then the big fellow went into direct action himself. He grabbed a bullet pass from Winsor Calkins, dashed half the length of the floor, whipped the ball over his head and Oregon was in the lead. But Cap wasn't through yet. Twice in the short time before the final gun he was fouled by Corvallis players, and both times he stepped coolly up to the gift line and dropped the ball through the basket.


