## ATO's Pledge Largest Neophyte Body

### Variety of States, Foreign Countries, Possessions Represented in List

Tabulation of the results of pledge week, which ended September 29, shows that the fraternities gained 285 new members, while the sororities pledged 230, a total of 531 new "Greeks" on the campus.

First place in point of numbers of new fraternity members goes to Alpha Tau Omega with 35 pledges. In the sororities, Chi Omega led with 25. Thus about 10.4 per cent of the total pledges were garnered by those two houses.

A large number of the pledges are from Portland, although Eugene placed a considerable number. Several states, as well as foreign countries and U. S. possessions are represented.
