First Regular Practice Is Foulk, fine prospect from Oregon Set for Today

Oregon's brilliant 1935 baseball nine wlil open its campaign for the northern division title this coming Friday and Saturday afternoons on the new diamond south of McArthur court in initial nonconference games against Linfield

The Webfoots will move into their quest for a second pennant with only four days of actual workouts behind them, for organized outdoor practice is scheduled to start this afternoon. To date only a few indoor workouts in Mc-Arthur court have been held.

Bill Reinhart, starting his welfth and final season as Oregon baseball coach, will field a veteran club for the opening games. The same nine which won the 1934 division title, plus several outstanding sophomores and newomers, will report today for the pening drill.

Two sophomores appear to be good bets to break into avrsity berths in their opening year. They are Dick Bishop, star catcher for the freshman last year, and John Lewis, rangy hoop star who is the leading candidate for third base

The remainder of the nine is xpected to be the same as that which won 10 out of 15 confernece games last spring to win the pennant. Harry McCall, southpaw first baseman, is the only doubtful contender, with Bun Kelsey, hardhitting transfer from Oregon Normal, his chief rival.
