Hobson Was Favored

Rail-bird experts have been hailing the S.O.N. mentor as the leading candidate for the position since Reinhart announced his resignation March 18 to accept his new post at George Washington uni-

Warren will step into the berth left vacant three years ago when Prince G. (Prink) Callison was promoted to head football coach. Since that time the yearling football, basketball, and baseball teams have been directed by varsity coaches out of their seasons, and by volunteer and student men-
