Revision Proposed for the Associated Students Constitution

Student Body Members To Make Decision On Thursday

CONSTITUTION OF THE ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF UNIVERSITY OF OREGON

Preamble We, the Associated Students of the University of Oregon, in order to promote and maintain those activities and interests which will contribute to the educational, physical and social well-being of the Associated Students of the University of Oregon, do ordain and establish the following Constitution.

Article I Name. The name of the association of students under this constitution shall be the Associated Students of the University of Oregon.

Article II Meetings Sec. 1. Regular meetings. There shall be two regular meetings of the Associated Students each year. The first meeting shall be held the third Thursday in April, at which nominations shall be made as herein provided. The second meeting shall be held on the call of the Executive Council on or before the fifteenth of May. At this meeting the newly elected student body officers shall assume their respective offices.

Article III Officers Sec. 1. The executive officers of this association shall be a president, vice-president, secretary, Executive man, executive woman, senior finance officer, and junior finance officer whom shall be chosen from the membership of the A.S.U.O.

Article IV Nominations and Elections Sec. 1. Elections shall be held on the seventh day following nominations. Sec. 2. Nominating conventions shall be held by the outgoing freshman, sophomore, and junior classes on the third Thursday in April.

Article V Executive Council Sec. 1. The legislative powers of the Associated Students shall be vested in an executive council. Sec. 2. Membership. The executive council shall consist of the following members:

Article VI Judiciary Committee Sec. 1. The judiciary committee, to which any member or administrative body of the Associated Students may refer any question on which it desires an opinion as to the correct judicial construction or interpretation of any part of this Constitution and By-Laws, shall consist of five members: dean of the law school or other member of the law school faculty, as permanent chairman, and four members appointed by the retiring president and president-elect of the Associated Students and the president of the University, not later than May 15th of each year.

Article VII Class Constitution Sec. 1. The officers of each class shall be a president, vice-president, secretary, and treasurer. Sec. 2. Qualifications of Candidates. Any member of a class who is in good standing in the University, as determined by the scholarship committee, and who can identify himself with that class which he seeks to represent

shall succeed to the office of senior finance officer in case of vacancy. Clause 3. Vacancies in the office of vice-president, secretary, executive man, executive woman, and junior finance officer shall be filled by special election called by the executive council. Clause 4. The definition of vacancy shall be provided by the Scholarship committee.

Clause 5. Tenure of office. Clause 1. The president, vice-president, secretary, and executive woman shall hold office for one year and shall be ineligible for reelection to any elective office of this association.

Clause 2. The executive man shall hold office for one year but shall not be eligible for election to any elective office of this association for which he is then qualified.

Clause 3. The junior finance officer shall be elected for a term of two years. He shall become the senior finance officer upon completion of his first year.

Clause 4. A special student body election, for the recall of any elective officer of the association, shall be called by the executive council on the petition of 25% of the members of the Associated Students. At such elections a two-thirds majority of the votes cast shall be necessary to recall the officer in question, provided, however, that there be at least 500 ballots cast.

Clause 5. All motions of other organizations, committees, and departments requiring appropriations of the funds of the Associated Students must be approved by the executive council before becoming effective.

Clause 6. Each candidate shall submit to the president of the A.S.U.O. on or before midnight of the second day before the day of the nominations a declaration of intention to run for office. Upon receipt of this it shall be the duty of the president to examine into the eligibility of each candidate in accordance with the requirements of this constitution and report his findings to the meeting at which the nominations are made.

Clause 7. All officers of this association shall be elected by a plurality of votes.

Clause 8. The executive council shall have complete supervision, management and control of all funds of the association with full power to pledge and or hypothecate the same and the fees herein designated to create said funds as security for any advances or loans made to the Associated Students and use said funds and or said fees in payment thereof.

Clause 9. The executive council shall order an annual audit of the books of the A.S.U.O.

Clause 10. Regular meetings of the executive council shall be held once in each month of the school year at a time and place to be determined by the said council.

Clause 11. Special meetings of the executive council shall be held on the call of the chairman or on written request of two members, provided, however, that all members shall be given notice of the time, place and purpose thereof at least 24 hours before the time set for the meeting.

Clause 12. Six members of the executive council shall constitute a quorum, provided there be at least one representative of the faculty, alumni, and students.

Clause 13. All appointments to membership on the executive council shall be made on or before May fifteenth of each year.

Clause 14. Any vacancy on the faculty or alumni membership of the executive council shall be filled by an appointment made by the president of the Associated Students and the president of the University.

Clause 15. All appointments to membership on the executive council shall be made on or before May fifteenth of each year.

Clause 16. The executive council shall employ the graduate manager, all coaches, trainers, and other employees.

Clause 17. The executive council shall have full control over all Associated Student activities and shall approve all schedules for such activities.

Clause 18. It shall be the duty of the executive council to require all officers of the association to comply with the provisions of the Constitution and By-Laws.

Clause 19. The executive council shall exercise all other powers in connection with the association affairs not delegated by this Constitution and By-Laws to other sources or reserved to the association itself.

Clause 20. The executive council shall employ the graduate manager, all coaches, trainers, and other employees.

Clause 21. The executive council shall have full control over all Associated Student activities and shall approve all schedules for such activities.

Clause 29. The executive council shall have full control over all Associated Student activities and shall approve all schedules for such activities.

Clause 30. It shall be the duty of the executive council to require all officers of the association to comply with the provisions of the Constitution and By-Laws.

Clause 31. The executive council shall exercise all other powers in connection with the association affairs not delegated by this Constitution and By-Laws to other sources or reserved to the association itself.

shall be eligible to become a candidate and to hold a class office and may take part in the activities of that class. All questions of class identity are to be decided by the faculty scholarship committee. Clause 1. Nominating conventions shall be held by the outgoing freshman, sophomore, and junior classes on the same day as the nominations for student body officers and in a manner provided for in this Constitution. Clause 2. The regular annual elections of officers of the above-mentioned classes shall be held on the same day and in the same place and manner as the elections of the Associated Students are held. Clause 3. Officers of the above-mentioned classes shall assume office at the beginning of the school year following their election. Clause 4. Freshman Nominations and Elections. Clause 1. The incoming freshman class shall hold a nominating convention within two weeks after the beginning of fall term and on a day designated by the president of the Associated Students, at which time a president, a vice-president, a secretary, and a treasurer shall be nominated. Clause 2. This nominating convention shall be conducted in the same manner and subject to the same regulations as the nominating convention of other classes, except that the president of the Associated Students shall preside and have charge of said nominating convention. Clause 3. The election of the freshman class officers shall be held one full week after the nominating convention has met. They shall be conducted in the same manner and subject to the same regulations as are the elections of other classes, except that the vice-president of the Associated Students shall have charge of said elections. Clause 4. Duties of Officers. Clause 1. The president shall be the presiding officer of his class; shall perform such duties as are required of him by this Constitution; and shall appoint such committees as are deemed necessary to the best interests of the class. Clause 2. The vice-president shall assume the duties of the president in his absence or inability to act. Clause 3. The secretary of each class shall keep a record of the proceedings of each class meeting and shall file the same in the office of the Associated Students at the close of the school year. Clause 4. The treasurer of each class shall have charge of class finances. Clause 5. The chairman of each special class committee shall, at the completion of his task, prepare and submit to the office of the Associated Students a detailed typewritten report setting forth the methods and procedure followed by his committee and criticism and suggestions for future application. Clause 6. Vacancies. Clause 1. The vice-president shall succeed to the office of president in case of vacancy. Clause 2. All other vacancies

shall be filled by a special nomination and election conducted in the same manner as the regular nominations and elections. Clause 8. Meetings. Meetings of the various classes shall be held at the discretion of the several class presidents, provided that notice of said meetings be published in the Oregon Daily Emerald at least one day previous to the day set for the meeting. Clause 9. Privileges. So long as any regularly enrolled student is in good standing in the University and has paid his class fees he shall be entitled to any and all privileges of the class with which he may be identified. Clause 10. Finances. Clause 1. Each class shall maintain an advisory committee, said committee to be composed of the class advisor, the president and treasurer of that class. Clause 2. It shall be the duty of the above mentioned committee at the beginning of the school year to prepare and submit to the graduate manager for his approval a budget of contemplated class receipts and expenditures for the ensuing school year. Further, it shall be the duty of the advisory committee to authorize all class expenditures and to audit all class accounts. Clause 3. No provision in this article shall be construed to impair the right of any class to levy such special assessments as they see fit, providing that such special assessment be approved unanimously by the advisory committee.

Article VIII Associated Women Students Sec. 1. Name. The name of this organization shall be the "Associated Women Students of the University of Oregon." Sec. 2. Membership. Every woman member of the Associated Students of the University of Oregon shall be a member of this organization. Sec. 3. The Associated Women Students shall adopt their own constitution subject to the approval of the executive council of the A.S.U.O. Sec. 4. Annual budget shall be provided for the Associated Women Students by the executive council of the A.S.U.O., estimates for which shall be submitted to the finance committee at the beginning of each school year. Sec. 5. The Associated Women Students shall be subject to the legislation of the executive council of the A.S.U.O.

Article IX Amendments Sec. 1. Amendments to this Constitution and By-Laws may be proposed at any regular or special meeting of the Associated Students provided said amendment is submitted on petition signed by at least 100 members. Sec. 2. The proposed amendments shall be printed in the Oregon Daily Emerald on the two following days and be voted on by ballot one week from the date of proposal. A two-thirds majority of the ballots cast shall be necessary for the adoption of any amendment, provided, however, that there be at least five hundred ballots cast.

Article X This article shall be effective for any particular year only if ninety per cent of the undergraduate students of the University are

members of the A.S.U.O. by the first Thursday in April. Section I. Divisions Defined. Clause 1. There shall be four divisions (1) Division I composed of all fraternity men (2) Division II composed of all sorority women (3) Division III composed of all dormitory and independent men (4) division IV composed of all dormitory and independent women. Clause 2. Each division shall meet and hold a convention the second Thursday in April at which each shall nominate two or more persons as candidates for the office of counselor. The names of the persons so nominated shall then be placed upon the ballot for general student body elections, and shall be voted upon by all persons entitled to vote on other student body officers. However, not more than one such nominee shall serve on the council from one political division. Clause 3. Four counselors shall be elected, one from each division. Where there are two or more candidates for the office of counselor from any one division, the candidate receiving a plurality of all the votes cast in the general election shall be declared elected as counselor from his division. Section II. Replacement. Clause 1. The four counselors chosen shall replace the officers of executive man, executive woman, junior finance officer, and senior finance officer. Sec. III. Requirements. Each counselor shall have been in the University at least five terms and fulfilled the requirements of the faculty academic regulations committee for the terms attended. Each counselor must be a member of the A.S.U.O. Section IV. Duties. The counselors shall take over the duties of the officers replaced by them; their individual duties and positions on standing and appointive committees to be determined by the incoming president of the A.S.U.O.; and the outgoing president of the A.S.U.O.; if no agreement can be reached the deciding vote to be cast by the president of the University. Section V. The Status of the Executive Council. The executive council so formed shall have the same duties and powers described in Article V of this Constitution. Section VI. The student officers of the A.S.U.O. shall be president, vice - president, secretary, and counselor for Division I, Counselor for Division II, Counselor for Division III, and Counselor for Division IV, herein provided for, these officers to be members of the executive council.
