FIGURES REFUTE BARRY'S CHARGES BRANDS LUISETTI AS REFEREE'S "PET"

TROJAN HOOP COACH

When Stanford's Hank Luisetti scored 30 points against Southern California in the game that dropped the Trojans from the leadership they will meet the swimming of the southern division, he started an argument or two among coaches, players, and other followers of the leather "borl." First, the controversy dealt with the question of whether or not 30 points in one game was a conference record. California scribes were quick to acclaim it as such, but statistically minded L. H. Gregory blew their stories up higher than a stork when he dragged from the past the 35 point shooting spree that was staged by Oregon's little Eddie Durno in 1919.

stand Sam. It's tough to be 15 points ahead in the middle of the second half of a game and then lose out by four points, particularly if you're


