

# Frosh, Rooks **Meet Tonight** On Igloo Floor

Final Battle of Freshman Teams Promises to Be Thriller; Both Squads After Victory

Tonight on the Igloo floor John Warren's devastating Ducklings wind up their annual "little civil war" series with Howard Maple's Oregon State rooks in what promises to surpass any battle of the original civil war in color and fireworks. Opening tipoff is at 8 o'clock, and admission with ASUO

The frosh hold two early season victories over the rapidly-improving rooks, while Maple's men took the last battle held at Corvallis by a comfortable margin.
