Queen Virginia will take to the air in a style show to take place Wednesday afternoon in a United Airlines mainliner. The plane will take off from Portland, rise to 20,000 feet, and circle Mt. Hood in its trip, during which Queen Virginia and the highest paid mannequins on the coast will model latest airplane travel fashions for style experts of the northwest.

The queen of the 1938 edition of Junior weekend will also enter into the national picture at the same time, Frager said, with traveling editors from Life, picture magazine, photographing and interviewing her for their publication. Newsreel cameramen will also be on hand to record the event.

Ten fashion editors from northwest newspapers will also be along on the trip, which is being arranged by Lipman and Wolfe company of Portland.
