

# New Award Announced For Mothers Attendance Here Junior Weekend

A new Junior weekend award, the Zell Brothers' trophy for the organization having the largest number of mothers attending the three-day campus holiday, was announced yesterday by Willie Frager, general chairman of Junior weekend.

The cup, a silver loving cup standing 20 inches high, will be awarded annually on a revolving basis, with the name of each year's winner inscribed on the back.

### Based on Registration

Awarding of the cup will be based on registration of mothers at Johnson hall during the two days of registration, Frager said.

The trophy bears the official name of "Zell Bros. Junior Weekend Trophy," with the inscription reading "Awarded annually to the organization having largest mothers' attendance."

The new trophy is a result of a recent trip to Portland by Willie Frager, who contacted Zell Bros. regarding the cup.

The cup will be on display at the College Side, Frager said.
