

District Librarians Convene on Campus For State Convention

Nash Is Principal Speaker at Luncheon; Library Conditions Are Discussed by the Representatives of Oregon Libes

Approximately 115 librarians convened yesterday in the new University of Oregon library for a record district meeting of the Oregon State Library association, headed by Harriet C. Long, state librarian. John Henry Nash was principal speaker at luncheon in the Anchorage after a morning spent in discussing the condition of libraries in Oregon, based on a recent survey of the field by Morris Isseks of the Bureau of Municipal research.

Panel speakers included Miss Mildred Oleson, Salem public librarian; J. E. Turnbull, trustee of the Eugene public library; and Willis Warren, University of Oregon assistant librarian. The group noted a detrimental lack in fiction and books in the field of social science in the majority of small libraries in Oregon.

The afternoon was spent in book talks by Miss Ethel Sawyer, browsing room librarian, and by Mrs. Marian Herr, head of the children's department of the Portland library association.

At 3:30 delegates inspected the John Henry Nash collection, now displayed in the library, and were served tea by the library staff before leaving Eugene for their respective homes.

Dr. George Rebec, dean of the graduate division, and S.
