

Three Astorians Line Up Against Visiting Cougars

Johansen, Sarpola, Anet to See Action In Tonight's Tilt

It will be two and possibly three of Oregon's "Flying Finns" who will line up against Washington State's quintet tonight.

Clever Wally Johansen was ranked as the outstanding guard on the Pacific coast last season. He teams with Bobby Anet to form Oregon's spectacular guard combine. Johansen is a brilliant ball-handler and floor man. He measures up to 5 feet 11 and scored 227 points in northern division point collecting.

Anet stands 5 feet 8, the shortest man on the squad, and was the sparkplug of the otherwise towering Webfoots last season. He is a wonderful ball-handler and excels at "feeding." Anet scored 178 points last season despite his preference to work the ball. He was adjudged the most popular and colorful player in the conference.

Loose-Jointed

The whirling dervish, Ted Sarpola, is adjudged by some critics to be surpassed only by Stanford's famed Hank Luisetti in ability to get away shots. He is one of the fastest men on the squad. Coach Hobson claims that he has "fast hands." Serving as a reserve forward, Sarpola scored 135 points last season.

With 210 points in his freshman year, Earl Sandness, the fourth Astorian, is making a bid for a varsity berth. He is a good ball-handler and has ability to get shots off from anywhere near the basket.

The fifth and last of the Astorian high school hoopsters is Toivvo Piippo. These men were coached by "Honest" John Warren in prep school days and also in their freshman days. Piippo was a regular member of the 37-38 yearling five. He scored 46 points from the back court.
