

Record Smashing Predicted by Seattle Coach

This afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at against the Husky, as the two tank teams meet. Things are apt to happen to existing records. Here's what Coach Jack Torney of the Washington brigade thinks:

At least six northern division and five Pacific coast records will fall before the meet is over There's very little doubt as to the fact that new records will go down for the 200-yard breast stroke and the 150-yard backstroke. Gene Caddy, Husky, has bettered the existing record by 1.7 seconds by doing 2:35. Jack Dallas has shaved 8.7 seconds from the existing coast record by making the time of 2:28. Ralph Lafferty, veteran Webfoot, will aid in this race.

Speedy Backstroker Sherman Wetmore, Duck flash and Franz Hoskins of Washington will furnish some real excitement in the backstroke. Hoskins is a veteran on the Husky squad, and he makes the 150 in 1:47.2.
