with the flanking ornamental iron fences, will be 180 feet. The total weight of the gates will amount to about 18 tons. The weight of the portion already fabricated is 15 tons. The WPA iron craft workers who did the ornamental work on the Timberline lodge are accomplishing the task. The main gate will be flanked by two pedestrian gates.

Through these portals will pass all the official guests of U. of O. The Oregon Dads' project will strive to make the visitor's first impression of the campus as beautiful and dignified as the Dads say the gates will be. This avenue through the campus will provide a starting place and goal for student parades, and will be the nucleus of many activities attendant upon University life.
