'Spring Frolics' Is First Outdoor Dance of Term

Kwama Sponsors All-Campus Caper At 4 o'Clock Today

Dancing on the new school tennis courts will be Oregon's salute to spring today, when returning students attend the first of the 1940 4 o'clock no-date "spring frolics." Today's dance is sponsored by Kwama, sophomore women's honorary.

A lengthy stag line was indicated by fraternity spokesmen last night to be "on deck" this afternoon when Bob Calkins' orchestra provides the swing for the first dance of the term.

An old-fashioned "soda pop stand" with white-uniformed Kwamas in attendance will replace the traditional punch bowl at today's dance.

Admission will be 10 cents for each person, with every dance a tag. "Forget about dates—just come over and talk to everybody again," Chairman Elna Johnson urged last night. "We want this afternoon's frolic to be a get-together for all those people who are plenty glad to be back to Oregon and to have spring term here again."

Although Kwamas last night "hoped for sunshine" they have made arrangements for the outdoor gym of Gerlinger hall in case dancers are rained out of the law school courts.
