Law Graduate Discusses Labor, Trade Disputes

A disagreement in commercial trade, in order to be classed as a "trade dispute," must have a substantial foundation on legitimate trade interests, and its subject matter must be directly connected with employment and labor conditions, it is declared by Orval Etter in the leading article of the latest issue of the Oregon Law Review, quarterly publication of the University of Oregon law school.

Etter is a research assistant in the bureau of municipal research and service, and a graduate of the law school. His manuscript was submitted in partial fulfillment of the requirements for a degree of doctor of jurisprudence, granted last year.

James D. Barnett, professor of political science, and John T. Gano, associate professor of history at the University of Oregon have book reviews published in the issue.

Mrs. Lois Baker Receives Librarian Fellowship at Yale

One of the two persons in the United States chosen by the Yale graduate school to receive a librarian fellowship this year was Mrs. Lois Baker, Oregon law school librarian.

Miss Baker received notification of the honor last week. The money value of the fellowship is \$1,200. She plans to leave for Yale in September.

"I intend to study in the Yale law library, since they have such a marvelous one there," she said.

She received her B.A. from Oregon in 1927 and her M.A. here three years later. After that she studied library work as a member of the University of California graduate school. She has been the University law librarian since 1936 and plans to resume her duties here in 1942 after a year's study in Yale.

Nash Collection Gets Shakespeare In Recent Edition

Twenty-four volumes of a new edition of Shakespeare designed by Bruce Rogers and printed by A. Colish of New York have been added to the John Henry Nash collection in the University library.
