Riley will be eligible for all fights to come, however.

Dallas, Wetmore, Al Sandner, Gerald Huestis, Cub Callis, and Dick Allen were the varsity men. Six men entered in nine events. Each man can only be entered in three events, so Hoyman could use only one man in some of the events. In fact, excepting the medley relay and the fourman relay, the 150-yard backstroke was the only event in which Hoyman entered two men-Wetmore and Huestis.
