OSC Professor to Describe Bonneville Tonight.

Hodge Plans Explanation Of Dam's Use

Speaker Will Cite **Defensive** Aspects Of Cheap Power

Dr. E. F. Hodge, professor of economic geology at Oregon State College, will speak on "Bonneville Dam-Its Location and Meaning" tonight at 7:30 o'clock in the faculty room of Friendly hall.

He will cover the subject from the aspect of its value to national defense in the present world crisis. The use of cheap power which will be furnished by the dam to process numerous economic minerals will be a large factor in this new development.

Dr. Hodge speaks from experience, since was one of the geolo-U.S. army engineers.

His knowledge gained in this capacity includes familiarity with economic minerals of the Northwest that might be processed with cheap Bonneville power.

Older faculty members at the University will remember him not only as a geologist, but also as an outstanding handball player.

Dr. Hodge's lecture is under the auspices of the University lecture committee and will be open to the public.






