(Continued from page one) and desires will determine the order in which new units are added. A ballroom, auditorium, banquet room, rooms for student offices, and meeting rooms and lounges are among facilities which will probably be included in the union.

Bartholomew Starts
Student desire for such a building was evidenced in 1922 under ASUO President Lyle Bartholomew, and agitation was begun for the building by John McGregor, Bartholomew's successor in 1923.

Shortly before, Prince L. Campbell, University president from 1902 to 1925, had inaugurated a proposed \$10,000,000 gift campaign which had as its aim a "greater Oregon." President Campbell's program was planned to provide needed improvements and equipment and to place the University on a par with eastern and European colleges.

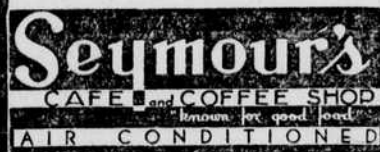
Incorporated in '24
In 1924 the student union idea was incorporated into the gift campaign, and an all-campus drive was organized to obtain pledges of \$10 annually from student and alumni donors for a 10-year period. More than \$200,000 was pledged, and erection of the desired building was thought near.

Enthusiasm gradually waned, however, and only \$20,000 was collected. Of the remaining \$180,000,

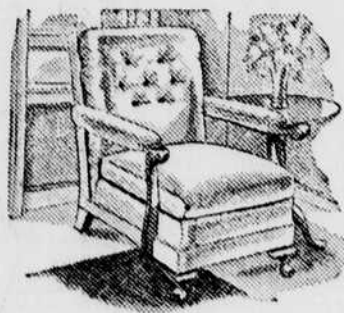

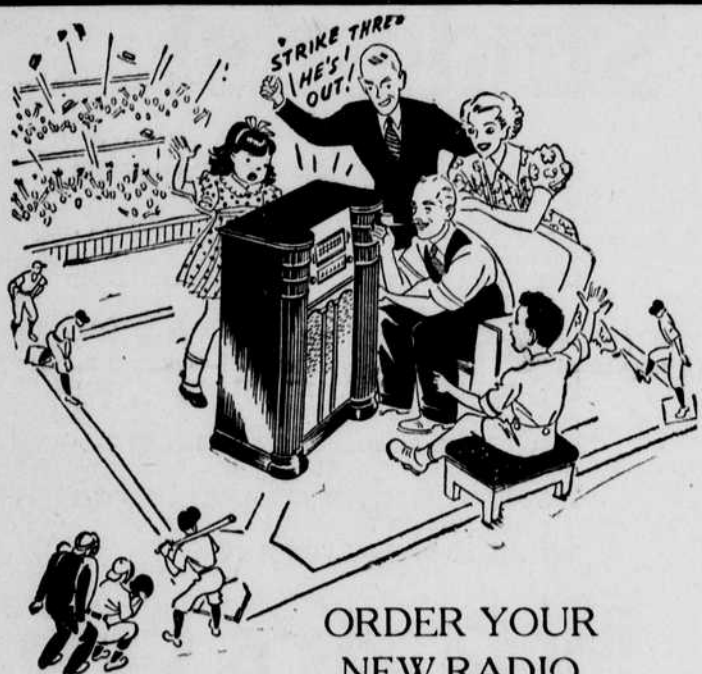
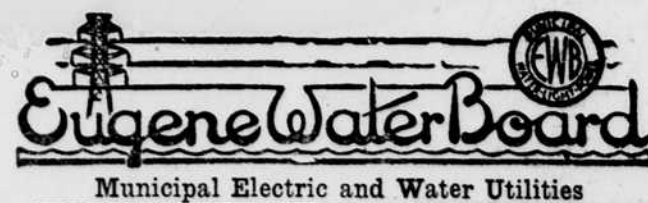
