

Templeton Has Novel Talents

Piano Recital Offered By Versatile Musician

As if being one of the outstanding pianists in the country weren't enough, Alec Templeton is also a recognized composer, plays the flute and is the master of several languages. Templeton, who will appear next Tuesday evening in McArthur court, has been afflicted with blindness since birth but this has not hindered his spectacular rise in the musical and entertainment world.

It was at the age of two that Templeton showed the first signs of his coming musical ability when he mimicked his older sister's exercises on the piano. Two years later he composed his first piece, a lullaby with which his mother used to sing him to sleep.

Humorous

The humor, which began with the imitations of his sisters, is still evident in much of his playing and Templeton frequently introduces a light note into his program by translating the laughter of his audience to the piano after one of his whimsical numbers.

Another of Templeton's novelties consists of working two or three numbers, which the audience requests, into one composition with each separate tune rec-

ognizable, yet all blended together.

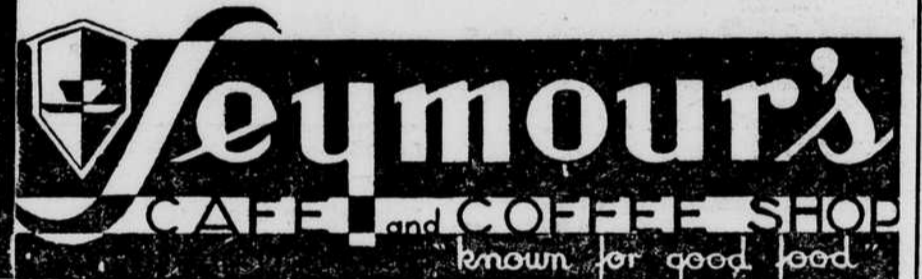
