

Oregon State Nine Nicks Ducks, 4-3

Clayton Shaw Flings Five-Hit Ball for OSC

Four runs in a wild first inning was enough to even the series as Oregon State's Beavers bounced a determined Web-foot nine on Howe field Saturday, 4 to 3.

With Clayton Shaw stopping Oregon's "murderers' row" on five hits and with perfect support from his Orange teammates after a four-error first inning when the Ducks scored three unearned runs, the Statars displayed fine defensive baseball.

Nick "Busher" Begleries, starting his first conference encounter, got off to a shaky start, but after the first frame allowed only two hits.

Durdan Hits

Don Durdan, Oregon State left-fielder, greeted Begleries with a sharp single into right. Ted Capka slapped a single to center. Dick Whitman allowed the ball to roll between his legs and Durdan scored, with Capka holding up at third.

Norm Peters walked, then Len Younce hit a triple against the bank in right field sending them across the plate. Younce scored a few plays later when Don Kirsch misplayed a ground ball.

The Ducks came back with three runs without a base blow in their half of the first to end the scoring.

Circus Catch

Doug Pederson, Beaver center fielder, saved the one run lead with a bare hand catch of Chuck Clifford's home run labeled hit in the fifth.

Two defensive plays by the Webfoots brought the fans to their feet. Kirsch went far to his left to make a diving stop of a hard hit ground ball to catch Capka at first. The other came with the bases loaded and two out in the ninth, when Bill Carney picked off a fly ball on his shoetops.

Fans were treated to an unscheduled attraction, when Umpire Spec Burke called Whitman out at first, and a post-game mixup started. With words flying fast among Burke, Clifford, Whitman and Coach Hobby Hobson. Fisticuffs ensued and in the melee Burke was knocked to the ground.

Oregon's varsity tennis team went under for the first time in four pre-conference starts, as the Leader club of Portland dumped the Ducks 7 to 2 on the University courts Saturday. The frosh outfit, however, drove Eugene high's netsters into the wire fence yesterday as they clubbed the Axemen 7 to 0.

Wayne Sabin, ranking amateur player, pulled down Oregon's Len Clark, Northern division singles champ, after two hectic sets of the best tennis seen over the University nets this season. Final score, 6-3, 6-4.

Coach Paul Washke's Webfoots leave tomorrow noon on a trek through the inland empire, opening their 1941 collegiate season. They play Washington in Seattle, Washington State in Pullman, and Idaho in Moscow.
