Ducks Clip Cougars Again, 5 to 4

Crish's Hit Breaks 10th Inning Deadlock, **Buck Bailey's Heart**

Buck Bailey headed back for the Palouse country Thursday, a sad and hoarse old man, after watching his Washington State Cougar diamondeers drop their second heart-breaking baseball game to the hard-hitting Webfoots, 5 to 4.

It was Tony Crish's long single to left, scoring Don Kirsch, in the tenth inning that broke a 4 to 4 tie, to give the Ducks their fourth straight, and fifth win of the season.

Little Nick Begleries, who started on the mound for Oregon, held the Cougars to two runs in the first eight frames while his teammates were sending in four tallies, but he couldn't stop them in the ninth and they pushed in two more scores to tie the count.


third inning, stopped the Ducks in their half of the ninth sending the game into extra innings. Pete Igoe, replacing Begleries, who was taken out for a pinch-hitter, set the Cougars down 1-2-3 in the tenth.

Don Kirsch was the first man up for the Webfoots in the tenth and he slammed a grounder down the third base line for a single. Dick Whitman sent him to second on a sacrifice. Then Crish, who had replaced Chuck Clifford, hit the pay off single scoring Kirsch from second. And that was the ball game.

Begleries kept the plate uncrossed until a pair of infield singles scored Bill Sewell in the fourth, while Oregon was picking up runs-one in each of the first three innings.

Clifford Receives Injury

The Webfoots won the game, but they lost the services of First Baseman Chuck Clifford for at least a week when he was spiked on the elbow while sliding into second early in the game.


