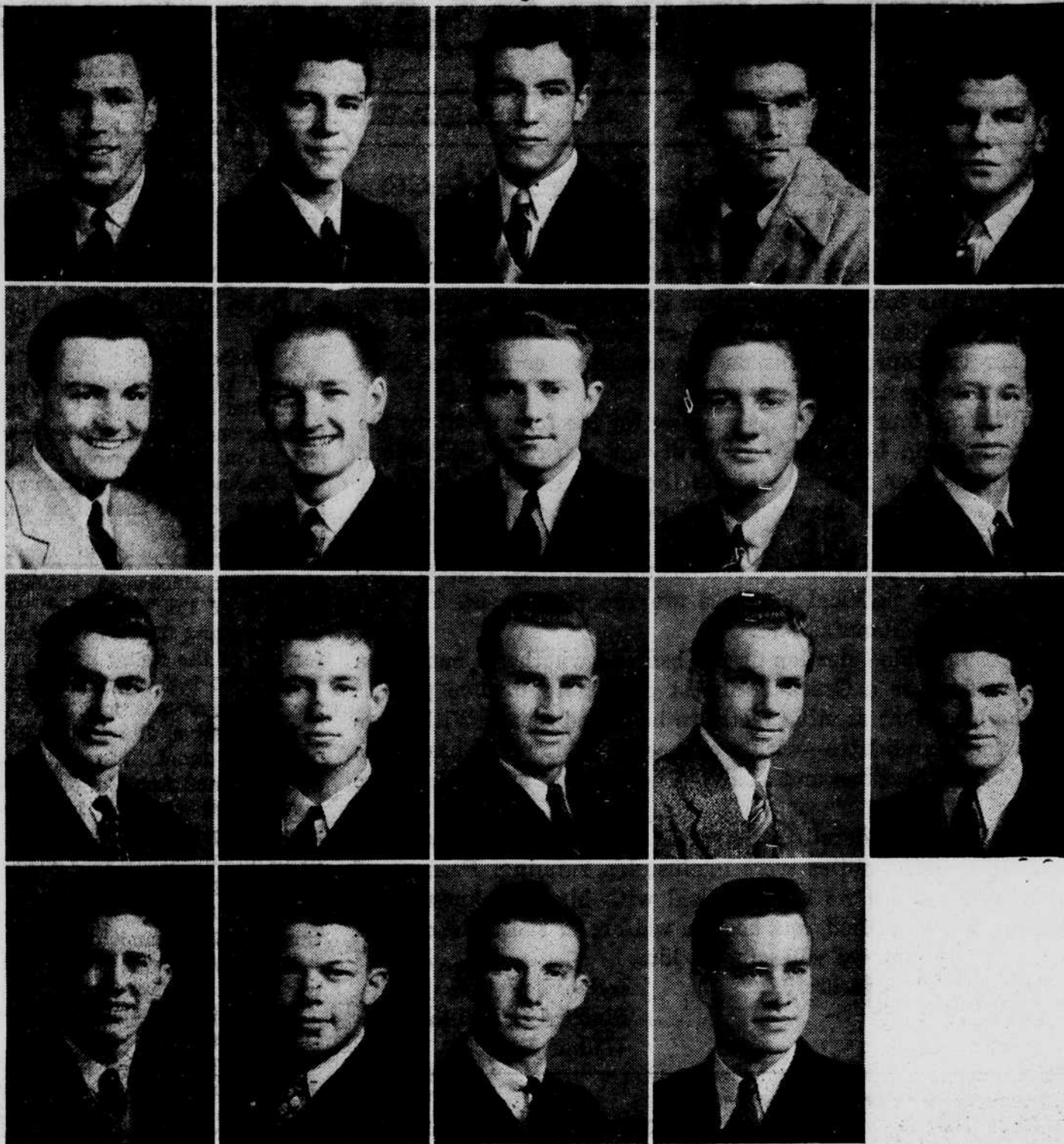


THE CLASS OF '44 CONTRIBUTES

Judicial Committee Interprets Ruling

In response to a protest by Steve Worth, the judicial committee of the ASUO Tuesday decided that students having a 2-point accumulative GPA may be eligible for ASUO offices.

Worth protested a by-law to the ASUO constitution October 8, 1940. The by-law provides that men students must have a 2-point GPA in order to be eligible for ASUO offices.

The protest declared that the amendment was ambiguous in its wording and could be construed to mean either a 2-point accumulative or a 2-point GPA for the previous term. The judicial committee had unofficially construed the amendment to mean the latter, and under this interpretation

had refused to accept Worth's petition for junior position on the executive committee.

Worth's protest was upheld, however, and the committee declared him eligible for the ex comm. position, on the basis of a 2-point-plus accumulative GPA.

It was not indicated whether a 2-point GPA for the previous term would also be considered sufficient for eligibility.

Hollis to Describe Selective Service

Orlando J. Hollis, professor of law and member of the Eugene selective service board, will discuss the "Operation of the Selective Service Act" at 8 p.m. Sunday evening at the Community Liberal church, Eleventh and Ferry.

The talk will be followed by an open question period. The public is invited to attend.
