Pallet Advises On Deferment

Students' Boards Should Have Plans Of Registrants

The University is anxious to cooperate with students desiring military deferment to complete their education and asks that they inform their draft boards on their plans, Registrar Earl M. Pallett last night told an assembly of men registered under the selective service act.

Students who have received their questionnaires should make two copies of a statement giving their probable date of graduation, plans for further preparation, vocational desires, and any contracts or assurances with respect to engaging in employment necessary in national defense. One copy should be sent to the man's draft board and one should be given to the registrar's office.

The registrar will prepare and mail to the man's board an affidavit giving his scholastic standing and other information useful for classification purposes.

The University will certify that men with a GPA of 2.25 or over are worthy of deferment, Mr. Pallett said, and will also explain if a man has grades sufficiently high to graduate.

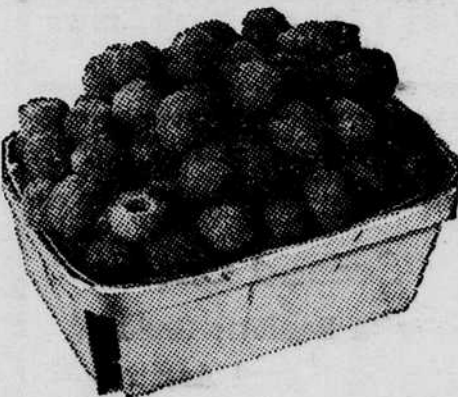
"We are playing fair and square; the University average is 2.4," Mr. Pallett continued.

He declared that there was reason to believe that boards would be more lenient than expected with academic students, although they are not engaged in training of defense use. The boards are expected to be lenient and are not likely to call a man in the middle of a term, nor are they likely to restrict possible deferment to seniors.
