Back from a near disastrous road trip into Washington and Idaho, Coach Howard "Hobby" Hobson sent his charges through a brisk practice session on Howe field yesterday.

The slugging Duck nine meets the Oregon State Beavers here Saturday in what may prove the making or the breaking of the Webfoots' championship hopes.

After dropping three of five conference tilts, the Oregons took another loss in a kings-X battle with the Portland Pilots, 9 to 11.

Bubalo Pitched

Johnny Bubalo, Oregon's man of every position, was the starting pitcher and was touched for all of the Pilots' runs.

Chuck Clifford and Captain Dick Whitman furnished the heavy artillery for the Webfoots' 13-hit attack on Portland hurlers Shaw and Pesky. Clifford connected for a triple with the bases loaded, to drive in three runs in a big seventh inning.

Four netmen—Len Clark, present northern division singles champ; Kerm Smith; Frank Baker; and Johnny Williams—and Coach Paul Washke rolled out of Eugene shortly after sun-up yesterday for Seattle, and will start back after the final rounds wind up Saturday. Twenty competitors are entered, four from each of the five schools.

Bill McArthur Gets High-Point Honors

Alpha Tau Omega was crowned 1941 Sigma Delta Psi champion on Hayward field Wednesday when they scored 381 points to win the annual meet. The Betas were second with 369, closely followed by the Phi Deltas with 366 points.

Bill McArthur of Abba Dabba won the individual championship with the fine score of 86 out of the 100 possible points. Curt Mecham, Pi Kap, finished second with 81 and Jim Marnie, SAE, was third with 72. Les Steers, Sigma Chi, was fourth with 71.

Records Broken

Three national records were broken in the meet. Steers jumped 6 feet 9 to break the old mark of 6 feet 6 3/4. Ray Dickson ran the 120 low hurdles in :13.18 cracking the old record by .02 of a second. Curt Mecham punted the football 72 yards, four yards better than the old mark.
