On October 2 Nelson will marry Miss Corinne Wignes, junior in journalism, who was alumni office secretary this summer. Miss Wignes will continue her work at the University this fall. She is president of Orides, independent women's group.

NYA's Allotment Cut; Graduate Jobs Open

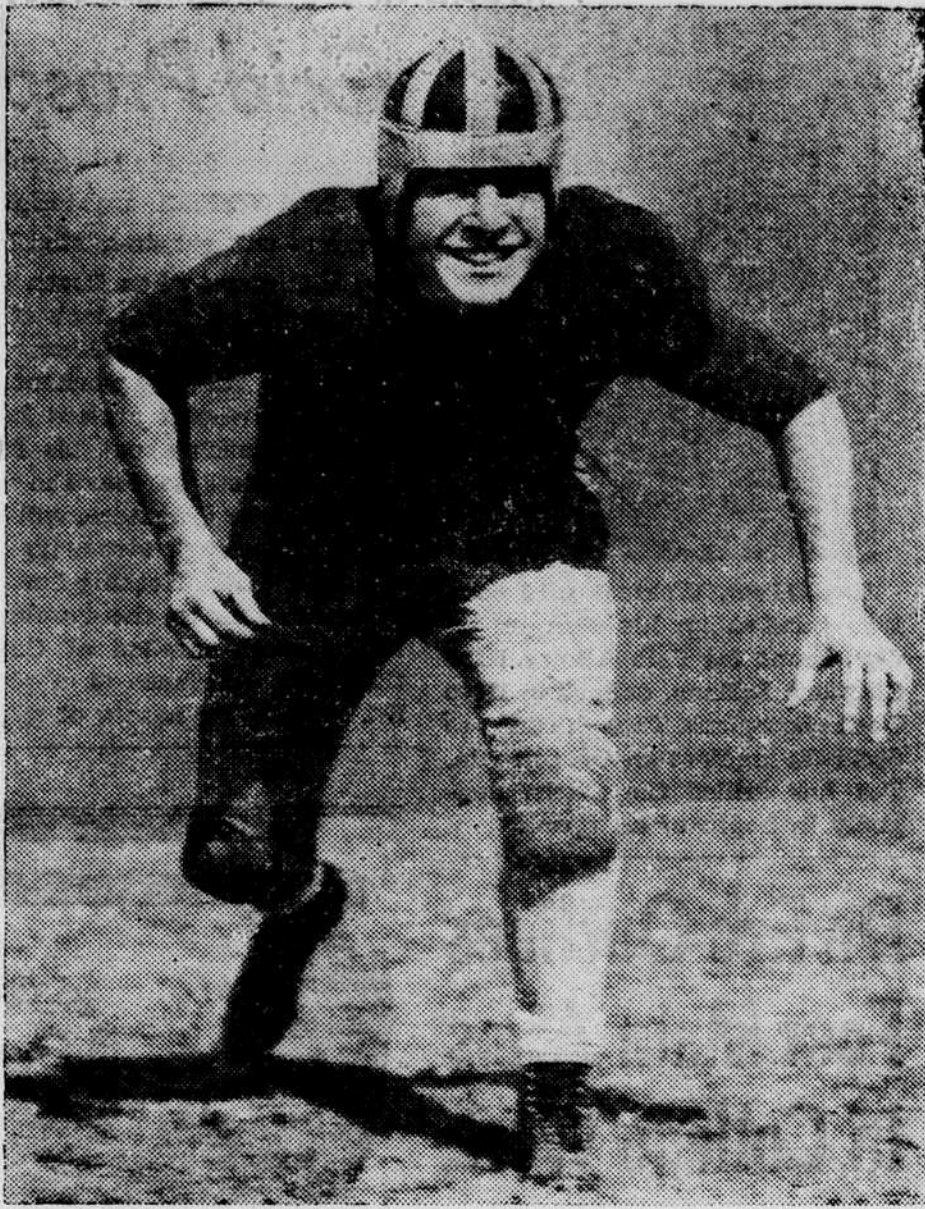

This year, as last, the cards cost \$9, but will admit the holder to events valued at \$29.95, Prongas said. Fall term there will be three Eugene games, two Portland games, and the holder will be allowed a \$1 discount on the Washington game in Seattle. As customary, persons buying athletic cards will be entitled to a \$1 discount on the 1942 Oregon.

Purchasers may pay \$5 fall term and the \$4 balance winter term, if they choose, Prongas said.

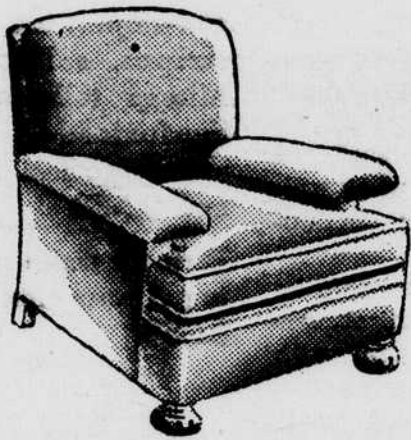

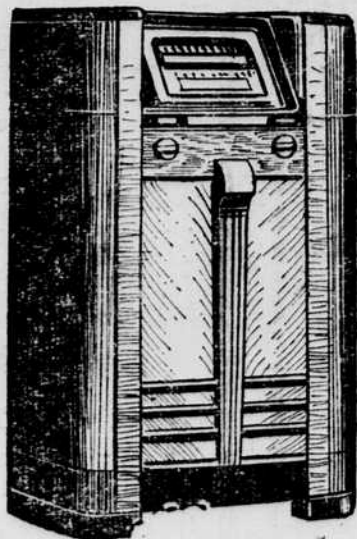

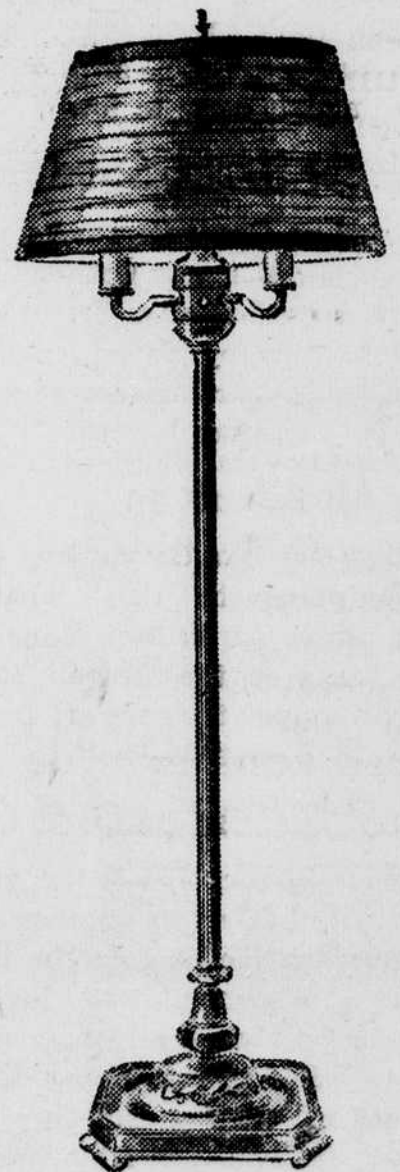
