

Two Fight Fire In Alpha Chi O

Fire of undetermined origin burned a woodpile and parts of the furnace room in the Alpha Chi Omega sorority house shortly before noon yesterday. Damage was slight.

Quick action by Mrs. C. A. Christianson, housekeeper, and Lee Spitzer, houseboy, probably saved the basement from further damage. They notified the Eugene fire department and played a garden hose on the burning woodpile.

The fire apparently started behind the woodpile "fairly high up." Eugene fire department officials and house officers dismissed theories that faulty wiring or a cigarette may have caused the fire. A "collar" had just been installed on the furnace to prevent fires being started from it.

No personal property of house members was destroyed, since the fire was held within walls of the furnace room.
