She laughed in her friendly manner, eyes squinted nearly shut in amusement, at the question of how Oregon boys compare to South Americans. "Oh, I like them! But, boys are boys the world over, aren't they?"

Toys, Tree to Sparkle At Annual Libe Party

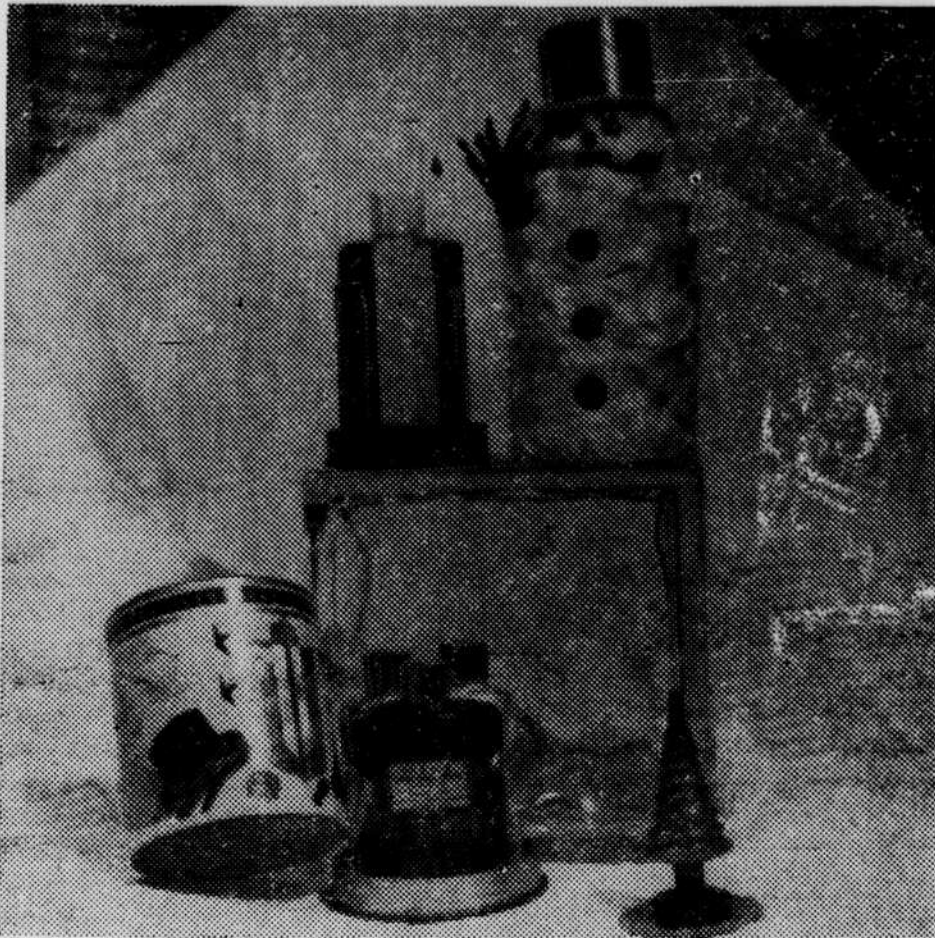
The annual library staff Christmas party will be held Saturday, December 13 at 9 p.m. in the browsing room.
