Positions Open In Coast Guard

United States coast guard has announced the 1942 competitive examination for appointment of catiets to the coast guard academy to be held May 13, 1942, according to information received from the dean of men's office.

This examination is open to University men between the ages of 17 and 22 years. The mental requirements are, in general, those necessary for admission to engineering colleges.

Located in East

The Coast Guard academy is located at New London, Connecticat. The course of instruction is basically scientific and engineering in character. Annual cruises are made to foreign ports.

Pay of a cadet while undergoing instruction is \$780 per year, plus an allowance for subsistence. After graduation, a cadet is eligible for a commission in the coast guard as ensign.

Coach Tex Oliver and Anse Cornell will join him there on their way home from the Texas game. The conference will last until Wednesday.


Artists Solve Gift Troubles; Make Their Own
