members are "conservatively estimated" at 40,000. There are 62
men's national social fraternities
and 34 women's social sororities,
not to mention the almost numberless honoraries and local fraternities, the report points out.

The plan deals with methods of contacting these organizations for defense savings purposes. The United States is divided into districts, and the districts into colleges and universities. These are divided into separate organizations which might have funds that could be converted to defense bonds.

Quotas

A quota system would need to be established, and a program would have to be worked out to make college students even more aware of the need for the funds, the report says. Possible results of a thorough campaign "would be hard to imagine." One of the principal aims of the program would be to take advantage of the "loose money" in the classes and other organizations.
