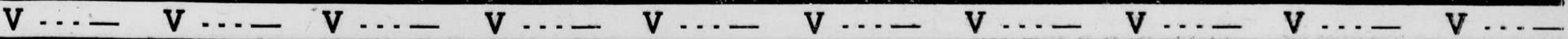
A Valentine supper will be a feature of the 6:30 p.m. Canterbury club meeting at St. Mary's Episcopal church. A special program and music will follow.
