# To Discuss War, Labor

The nation-wide recognition given to Wayne L. Morse, dean of the law school, for his outstanding contributions as a labor arbitrator makes his appearance before the last general assembly of the term, 11 a.m. today, an event of special interest to the University upon which his increasing achievements are a glowing reflection.

Dean Morse, who has delivered a majority of the decisions of the national war labor board, will discuss the major problems of labor during the war period, giving a resume of what is happening in the labor movement,
