

# Diet Course Gains Credit

Principles of dietetics is the official title of the course that will earn a Red Cross certificate for girls taking the course this term, it has been announced by Miss Mabel Wood, head of the home economics department.

This is a regular course given by the home economics department, but spring term one section of girls enrolled will be taking it for a double purpose: to earn two hours of University credit, and to earn a Red Cross nutrition certificate which is given for twenty hours of work of this type.

### Combination

The girls who enrolled in the special section of this course are planning to take also another course directly from the Red Cross which will fit them for work as members of a canteen unit to serve food in case of an emergency and prepare meals for troops that may pass through their area. The principles of dietetics will prepare them for this special ten-hour course.

The course is a combination of lectures and demonstrations. Text for the study is "Nutrition and Physical Fitness," by Bogart. Dietary essentials and some practical nutrition problems will be discussed. Some aspects of nutrition that are studied are weight control, digestion, and child feeding.

### National Defense

Girls taking the course in order to prepare themselves for the national defense work should contact Miss Wood before the end of the term to determine what time it will be most convenient for all concerned to have the class.

Miss Wood will teach the two-hour course which she has announced, can be held any time on Tuesday or Thursday, but can not possibly be given at 11 o'clock on Monday or Wednesday, or at 8 o'clock Monday or Friday.
