Carnegie Prints Work on Oregon

The Carnegie Institution of Washington, Washington, D. C., will soon publish a work on "Archeological Researches in the Northern Great Basin of Central Oregon," prepared by Dr. Luther S. Cressman, head of the anthropology.

This publication is one of a series of publications by the institute on American anthropology. The material in the publication has been collected over a period of years dating back to 1934. Portions of the material have been previously published and this publication will be comprehensive.

Dr. John C. Merriam, president emeritus of Carnegie Institution wrote the foreword to the work. Last year, while on leave with the Guggenheim fellowship, Dr.

Cressman spent his time studying collections in museums throughout the United States and writing a report on these collections.

Chapters have been contributed by specialists in other fields. Dr. Henry P. Hansen, of Oregon State College, wrote a chapter on pollen profiles of Lower Klamath Lake, and Dr. F. C. Baker, of the University of Illinois, wrote a chapter on the mollusca of the same region.

Dr. P. S. Conger, of the Smithsonian Institute, wrote on diatoms. Dr. Robert Heizer, who headed the anthropology department at the University in Dr. Cressman's absence, wrote a chapter on archeological materials in private collections.

Two UO Grads Navy Casualties

In its first official, although incomplete casualty list of the war, the navy department has recorded two former University of Oregon students among the fatalities of war from Dec. 7 to April 15.

Ensign Eldon Paul Wyman, ex-graduate of the '41 class at the University, is listed on the navy's casualty roll from the Pearl Harbor attack. On the campus a member of the Alpha Tau Omega fraternity, he enlisted in the U. S. naval reserve training school at Chicago in June, 1941, and was sent to duty on the U.S.S. Oklahoma.

Ensign Verdi Sederstrom, graduate of the University in 1940, enlisted in the naval reserves in April 1941, and was sent to training school at Philadelphia. He was on duty on the U.S.S. Arizona. He was active in student affairs while on the campus, being first vice-president of the student body in 1940.
